

ADMISSION GUIDELINES

- BS degree in agriculture, education or related field from an accredited university
- Minimum 3.0 GPA in undergraduate studies
- GRE score of 1000 minimum combined score—480 verbal required
- Once admitted, you must attend a mandatory orientation and learn more about the program.

Online Master's in Agricultural Education

AT MONTANA STATE UNIVERSITY

The online master's program is designed to meet the needs of professional agricultural educators and extension agents. The program offers online graduate level courses that allow completion of a Master of Science degree in Agricultural Education. The curriculum includes courses in technical agriculture, educational methods, research and program development. Participants will be required to attend an orientation session and present their professional paper on campus. Other meetings may be scheduled as needed.

PROGRAM FEATURES

- 30 credits completed in approximately six semesters (two years)
- Minimum of six credits per semester and three credits in the summer
- All courses offered online
- Asynchronous coursework
- Written exam and professional paper in lieu of a thesis
- Individual academic advisor
- Limited face-to-face interaction
